

Suffer the Little Children

Brief description: Stained glass panel from centre light showing children on steps, the botom half of a scene depicting Suffer the Little Children.

The bottom half of Christ (wearing a red robe) and the lower half of a woman and a child he is blessing can be seen in this stained glass panel. They are all standing on stone steps. At the bottom of the steps a child wearing a blue robw looks at some birds pecking the ground, while another child behind him begins to ascend the steps, looking up to Christ. The panel was part of the middle light (third panel from top) of a window depicting the Ministry of Christ.
