Brief description: Stained glass panel depicting Jesus Christ's baptism the river Jordon. Made by C E Clutterbuck, in about 1867.

Stained glass panel depicting Jesus Christ's baptism in the river Jordon. Christ and John the Baptist stand facing each other. Christ wears a red robe from the waist down and a white robe above off the shoulder and held in front with both hands. He is standing ankle deep in water. John stands on the bank pouring water from a small dish over Christ's head. In his left hand he holds a staff. He wears a rough tunic under yellow gown. Both figures are bearded. A dove is above, from it shines golden rays. Christ is nimbed. Made by Charles Edmund Clutterbuck, in about 1867.
