Brief description: Stained glass panel depicting Jesus healing a blind man. Made by C E Clutterbuck, in about 1867.

Stained glass panel depicting the biblical story Jesus Christ healing the blind. Jesus stands on the right on the vesica and stoops towards a kneeling figure who is blind. Jesus is touching the figures eye in a gesture of healing. Christ, nimbed, wears a blue robe with a red cloak across one shoulder. The blind man's arms are crossed, he has a wooden staff. He is wearing a short tattered yellow gown under a pale cloak. The other figure stands behind him in a blue gown and red turban. The scene is enclosed in a mandorla with decorative scrolling behind. Made by Charles Edmund Clutterbuck, in about 1867.
