In front of them is a statue of a woman in Greek costume. Behind her is an oil lamp and a shield. In the background is a palace. The presentation box has red material inside.

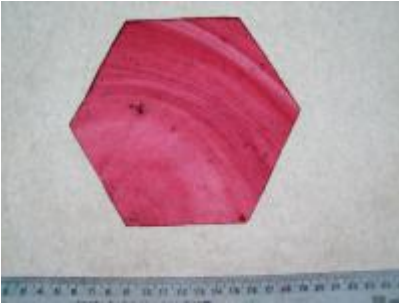

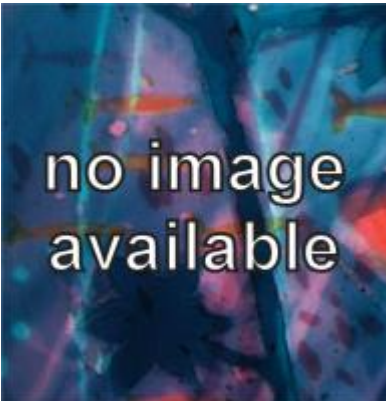
