Brief description: Stained glass window depicting George III in his coronation robes.
Made by James Pearson, 1793.

Stained glass window depicting King George III in Coronation robes seated in 13 century coronation chair in Westminster Abbey. This monumental image of George III (1760-1820) is a copy in glass of the portrait painted by Sir Joshua Reynolds in 1780. The King is dressed in his coronation robes and is seated in the medieval coronation chair in Westminster Abbey. Pearson's stained glass was much admired for the way in which he cut large pieces of glass so that the leads could be hidden in the design. His approach to design was not unlike that of medieval glass-painters, although his painting technique, using coloured enamel pigments, was quite different.
