A design for a stained glass window made up of three lights, these lights are incomplete. The left light depicts King Solomon, the top scene shows him overseeing the building of the temple and below he is dedicating the temple, Aaron is in the background. These scenes are divided with decorative panels. The centre light depicting Saint Malachy- Archbishop of Armagh. The scene from his life has not been designed. The right panel depicts Saint Paul, he is holding a sword and a book. All three figures are nimbed.


