



Saint Paul and Saint Barnabas

Brief description: Stained glass panel depicting Saints Paul and Barnabas healing a crippled man. Designed by Westlake and made by Lavers, Barraud and Westlake.

Stained glass window depicting Saint Paul healing a man who had been unable to walk since birth. On the left of the panel is a seated figure, naked except for a loincloth. Above him stands Saint Barnabas, in green robes and next to him Saint Paul, bald but with a curly beard. He wears a red robe, orange cloak with his arms extended in a blessing gestures. Round arched frame, yellow borders, dream glass, alternating orange and red medallions. In the background is sky, tree and standing figures.
