Brief description: Stained glass panel depicting Jesus ascending to heaven. Made by C E Clutterbuck, in about 1867.

Stained glass panel depicting the biblical story of Jesus Christ's ascension to heaven. The vesica contains six figures. Christ is in the centre. He wears a halo, a blue robe and a red cloak. His hands and feet show stigmata. He is ascending, slightly above the grond and is in a white cloud. Five apostles are grouped below. The scene is enclosed in a mandorla with decorative scrolling behind. Made by Charles Edmund Clutterbuck, in about 1867.


