RISK ASSESSMENT ADVICE FOR TEACHERS AND GROUP LEADERS

The following information is provided to help you prepare a risk assessment for your visit to The Stained Glass Museum.

Planning Visits

We strongly recommend that you make a pre-visit before you bring your group so that you can assess potential hazards for yourself, both in our venue and on your journey to us. Please email learning@stainedglassmuseum.com or call 01353 660347 to arrange a free planning visit.

Our Gallery and Workshop Areas

All the Museum's public areas have been designed and maintained to ensure they are safe for schools, groups, and other visitors. These spaces are checked on a daily basis to remove or minimise hazards. Please be aware that the Museum is accessed via a stone spiral staircase (40 steps). There are no toilet facilities in the Museum or workshop area, the nearest are next to the Lady Chapel on the ground floor of the Cathedral.

Our Activities

All our activities are designed and managed to remove or minimise hazards and we carry out a risk assessment for each activity. For example, any materials, equipment or objects used are checked to make sure they are safe and any trip/slip hazards are removed or steps taken to minimise their risk. Risk assessments are reviewed and updated on a regular basis to ensure that they reflect any changes to the activities or spaces in which they take place. If a session involves a specific hazard that we feel group leaders or participants should know about, we will send this information in advance of the visit and remind the group leader at the beginning of the activity.

Our Staff and Volunteers

Our Learning Officer, staff, volunteers and freelancers are required, where eligible, to undertake an enhanced DBS check. Everyone is familiar with and complies with our Safeguarding Children and Vulnerable Adults Policy and associated procedures. Please also read our Safeguarding policy which is available on the Learning pages of our website. Whilst we may split your group for certain activities, either you or your accompanying adults must remain with your group at all times. We will provide information on group activities in advance so that you are well-informed about restrictions on group sizes and timetabling of activities. Please do bear in mind that sufficient staffing will be needed to remain with groups if individual children need to be escorted downstairs to the toilets during sessions.

Fire and Evacuation

We have fully tested evacuation procedures in place in case of fire or other emergencies. In the case of an evacuation, school groups are escorted to an evacuation point by our staff or volunteers who work with teachers to ensure all pupils are present and safe.

First Aid

A First Aider is always available within the Cathedral. Please inform our staff or Learning Volunteers if anyone in your group requires assistance due to illness or injury.

Insurance

We have public liability insurance providing cover up to f5million through Ecclesiastical Insurance.

Health and Safety

We have a written health and safety policy and all our staff receive health and safety training appropriate to their role.

Lost Children

Please inform our staff or Learning Volunteers immediately if any child becomes separated from the group and you are unable to find them. We have established procedures in place to deal with these situations efficiently.

Supervision

Group leaders and accompanying adults are responsible for the general health and safety of their group and should remain with them at all times in our building and during any emergency evacuations. We recommend the following adult to child ratios:

- 0 2 years one adult to three children
- 2 3 years one adult to four children
- 4 8 years one adult to six children
- 9 12 years one adult to eight children
- 13 18 years one adult to ten children

(based on current NSPCC guidelines)

We reserve the right to refuse entry when the level of adult supervision falls short of a ratio of 1:15.

COVID-19 Information

All teachers and students should stay alert, practice social distancing, and follow government guidance (wash hands, cover face, make space). All teachers and students should wear a face covering throughout their time at the museum, unless exempt. A teacher or a student should not attend a learning session if you have any of the following symptoms of coronavirus (COVID-19): new continuous cough, a high temperature, a loss of, or change in, your normal sense of taste or smell (anosmia). If you do have any of the above symptoms you should follow the government and NHS guidance about self-isolating. Schools will be notified and reminded of this prior to the session and on arrival. Please note our usual Cancellation Policy still applies if schools cancel because they are self-isolating.

We will ask all school teachers to scan a QR code to check-in using the NHS COVID-19 App, or to provide us with their name, a contact phone number, date of visit, arrival time and, where possible, departure time. As per our data protection policy, we will hold the records for 21 days, before deleting or disposing of them securely. As per the museum's Data Management Policy, all collected data will comply with GDPR and should not be kept for longer than necessary.

We aim to maintain social distancing wherever possible and have put additional measures in place to enable people to work safely. Where possible, we aim to maintain at least 1m between people by providing separate spaces apart to ensure people are working in designated spaces 1m apart. We will be putting up signs to remind staff and visitors of social distancing guidance.
